Course Description

This course is an expositional study of the books of Judges and Ruth.

Course Objectives

After completing this course the student will:

- 1. Remember the basic content and message of Judges and Ruth.
- 2. Identify the major themes in Judges and Ruth.
- 3. Know the major problem passages and their possible solutions in Judges and Ruth.
- 4. Gain a greater appreciation for the canonical contribution of Judges and Ruth.
- 5. Grow in spiritual maturity by learning the spiritual lessons found primarely in the persons and events in Judges and Ruth.

Course Textbooks

- 1. The Bible
- 2. Class notes

Note: The student will be responsible for reading the Bible passage that will be discussed that day before each class and also any assigned class notes or handouts.

Course Assignment Description

- 1. Read the entire Book of Judges and Ruth at least once during the length of the course. There is no substitute for reading the Scriptures!
- 2. Keep a notebook (preferably a 3-ring binder) devoted *specifically* to Judges and Ruth. The notebook should contain the course handouts, your notes, and any assignments that you do for this course. Organizing these materials now will make them accessible in the future as you continue your studies and as you may have opportunity to teach the book.
