Exposition of the Book of Mark Syllabus

Course Description

This course is an expositional study of the Book of Mark.

Course Objectives

After completing this course the student will:

1. Remember the basic content and message of the Gospel of Mark.
2. Identify the major themes of the Gospel of Mark.
3. Know major problem passages and their possible solutions in the Gospel of Mark.
4. Gain a greater appreciation for the canonical contributions of the Gospel of Mark.
5. Grow in spiritual maturity through careful and consistent application of the principles found in the Gospel of Mark.

Course Textbooks

1. The Bible
2. Class notes

Course Assignment Description

1. Read the Gospel of Mark at least twice during the length of the course. There is no substitute for reading the Scriptures!
2. Keep a notebook (preferably a 3-ring binder) devoted *specifically* to the Gospel of Mark. The notebook should contain the course handouts, your notes, and any assignments that you do for this course. Organizing these materials now will make them accessible in the future as you continue your studies and as you may have opportunity to teach the book.

Graded Option

Students interested in an enhanced learning experience can elect to participate in a graded option. For the voluntary option the student will be required to do the Bible reading, two additional written assignments, take the exam, and attend 75% of the class sessions (cannot miss more than 8 sessions or 4 nights). The student should let the instructor know that they want to participate in this option. **This option is completely voluntary.**
